***RABBI'S MESSAGE***

Ⓜ Repeating Record+

Here we go again. Iç never forget how 36 years ago, in Clarksburg, West Virginia,

we were preparing for the Seder. Carole was being helped by another young woman, who was the Catholic girlfriend of a member of our Clarksburg congregation. She asked Carole in all innocence, Ⓜ Passover when the Jews burn the body of Jesus?+. Did you know we did that every year before the Seder? What was going on here? In the Catholic church unleavened bread is used in the communion service. In Catholic belief, through the miracle of transubstantiation, that unleavened wafer becomes the Ⓜody of Jesus+. The questioner was probably thinking of be-ur hametz . the act of burning hametz (leavened food products) on the eve of Pesach. This is done mostly by Orthodox Jews. Theyç actually burning unleavened

bread, not matzah. One, however, could easily get that fact mixed up. Since this Catholic young lady was taught that the unleavened wafer becomes Jesusçbody, and that Jews have a burning ceremony on the eve of Passover, and that Passover is connected in the New Testament narratives of Jesusçcrucifixion, then itç not too much of a stretch to have us burning his body. This woman, incidentally, went on to covert to Judaism and she became a pillar of that tiny, struggling congregation.

Also associated with Passover is the notorious ðblood libel+ - that we use the blood of a Christian child to bake matzot. One theory of why we open the doors to Elijah is to show passersby that no such grizzly sacrifice is going on. The blood libel, however, has cost countless Jewish lives in Europe over the last millenium. As late as the early 20th Century, Jews were still being accused of this horrible crime. One time when I was teaching this to a group of middle school children, one child retorted: Ⓜhatç crazy, if matzah were made from flour and blood, it would come out a dark reddish brown, not a light beige!+

Reflective Music will be provided by Laura Rosenberg, Director of Hot Springs Music Festival, and Mara Magdalene. Carla Mouton will be the moderator of the service. Audience participation will emphasize how we all can come together despite our differences and because of our similarities to create a more peaceful world here ó in Hot Springs, in our homes, in ourselves.

This interdenominational service is being sponsored by the Holocaust Remembrance Education Committee and the Congregation House of Israel on May 1st, the International day of Remembrance of the six million Jews and the six million others murdered during the Nazi Holocaust during World War II. The Holocaust Committee is made up of John Wells, Joanne Reagler, Carla Mouton, Sue Koppel, Mary Watermann, Patti Fleischner, and Carol Kleinman.

We hope the sun will shine on this late afternoon of May 1st when we, of many faiths, come together in prayer, remembrance, and song.

The Institute of Southern Jewish Life has programming galore. Congregation House of Israel has barely tapped that resource – Jewish culture, education, and enriching programming.

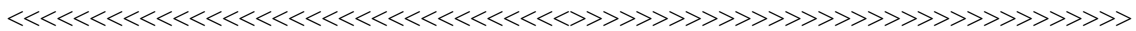
Of course, we have challenges. What is new?

**Rabbi's Message** (continued from pg. 2)

Let us focus now on a newer, more sophisticated form of the old calumny. Over the last decade, Israel's enemies, in an effort to delegitimize the State of Israel, have offered a new blood libel. That is that the State of Israel and its army purposely murder innocent Palestinians.

To wit: The horrible death of Muhammed Dura in 2001. He was the little Palestinian boy being sheltered by his father's body during a fire-fight between Tzahal (the Israeli Defense Forces) and Hamas terrorists in Gaza. We all remember the horrible video of that scene. Guess what? The Israelis conclusively proved that the child was actually killed by Hamas fire.

In April 2002, when Israeli forces attacked Jenin, a hotbed of suicide bombers, Israeli soldiers carefully went house-to-house searching for terrorists. At least a dozen Israeli soldiers lost their lives by bending over backwards to avoid harming innocent civilians. Guess what? The PLO claimed that the Israelis massacred hundreds of Palestinian civilians, and that their bodies were in a mass grave on the grounds of the Jenin Hospital. Search as one could, but there were no bodies! Even the anti-Semitic UN had to admit that no massacre had taken place.

A similar charge was lodged against Israel last summer when Israeli troops intercepted the Turkish ship, the Mari Marmara, which was trying to break Israel's blockade of Gaza. In the ensuing fight, nine Turks were killed. They, however, were not peaceful protestors; they came at the Israeli soldiers with knives and clubs. At least one Israeli was thrown overboard.

Finally, a month ago, South African (Jewish) judge Richard Goldstone wrote an op-ed piece in the Washington Post recanting most of the report that bears his name. That UN-sponsored report charged the IDF forces with targeting Palestinian civilians during the 2008-09 Operation Cast Lead in Gaza. It was sponsored by the UN Human rights Commission (notoriously anti-Israel). Despite his impressive resume as a jurist, evidently Judge Goldstone was duped. Hopefully, pro-Israeli forces will coerce the UN to reverse itself.

Surely there will be more chapters in this sad saga. The next time you hear of Israeli massacres, check out from where it is emanating.
